Regarding name of University it was informed to the House that earlier also an effort was made and comments of departments were sent vis.a.vis change in the name of the institute. It was decided that departments shall again send the recommendations to DAA on the issue.</p>	<p>Senate has accepted the proposal which deliberates on three aspects of internship namely allocation, monitoring and evaluation. Tech candidates to Ph.D. program. Out of eight departments, six departments have agreed for direct admission of BE / B.Tech. candidates to Ph.D. program with certain conditions except two departments (Civil Engg. deptt. & Mechanical Engg. deptt.).</p>	<p>After detailed deliberations, the Senate approved the direct admission of BE/ B. Tech candidates to Ph. D degree with following guidelines:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. All candidates having BE / B. Tech degree would be eligible for admission to Ph.D. program 2. To be eligible for the admission under this category, a candidate is required to have minimum CGPA of atleast: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) 9.0 (on a scale of 10) at the end of the seventh semester (if applying during final year) under OPEN and OBC categories. b) 9.0 (on a scale of 10) at the end of the eighth semester (if applying after the completion of B.Tech) under OPEN and OBC categories. c) For SC/ST category students, the minimum CGPA requirement will be relaxed to 8.5. 3. After detailed deliberations</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Senate, in principle, approved the proposal on introduction of MOOCs in the UG/PG curricula as given in Annexure- III. 2. The Scheme will be implemented from 2017-18 session. 3. For its proper implementation, the Senate desired that the details be worked out by the Committee already constituted for this purpose. The Committee may coordinate with each department to identify courses to be run through MOOCs for each semester in each UG and PG programmes. 4. The departments will identify faculty members to be sent for pedagogy training on MOOCs. <p>Additionally, the faculty members may themselves study at least one course on MOOCs. The cost of MOOCs courses may be borne from PDA of faculty members.</p>

GUIDELINES FOR 6TH SEMESTER INTERNSHIP OF UG STUDENTS:**I. Allocation**

- a. Efforts for allocating of students for training purpose should start in the beginning of 5th semester.
- b. The institute should put in efforts to increase the placements of students for training purpose upto 72-80%.
- c. The students who are arranging their own training should give the confirmation at least two months before the start of the training.
- d. Institute should also tie-up with TPO offices and departments of other renowned academic institutes and also look for placing students for training purpose in various PSUs like PWD, Electricity Board, irrigation, BHEL etc.
- e. The option of paid internships in renowned companies may also be explored.

II. Monitoring:

- a. The institute may ask the companies to allocate mentors to the students so that they can interact with each other before joining the internship and do ground work to make is more effective.
- b. The institute should also maintain a database of all mentors.
- c. The visit of faculty coordinators to the industries may not be necessary Skype interaction can be done by the faculty with the student and mentors But if faculty is interested in visiting the companies/ institute, they can visit and interact with the institution head also and not just with the mentors.

GUIDELINES FOR MONITORING PERFORMANCE OF DEFICIENT STUDENTS

- 1) The registration plan for next one year may be decided by DAPC.
- 2) Monthly meeting of DAPC for monitoring progress of student.
- 3) Result of mid-term, quizzes, assignments etc. may be communicated to the parents electronically.
- 4) Meeting of HOD with parents/ guardians of students after mid-term exam in the presence of Institute Counsellor.
- 5) Extra classes may be engaged for such students.

Existing regulations in respect of these students including those related to reduced academic load would remain in place.

POLICY FOR OFFERING COURSES THROUGH MOOCs

In order to provide a world class learning experience and offer greater flexibility to students and keeping in view the rising popularity of MOOCs, policy guidelines as given below will be followed:-

- The students will be allowed to take up one course per semester per program (after duly mapping the MOOCs with the curriculum) by registering for a MOOC offered by EdX/ Coursera/ Future Learn/ Mookkit/IIT Bombay kit/ Swayam portals.
- The registration fee (approximately 40-50 \$ per candidate) for the MOOC shall be paid by the institution out of the tuition fee paid by the student.
- The students would be required to complete the MOOC course right upto certification level and the grades obtained would be embedded into our grading system.
- A teacher would be assigned to each MOOC course with a work load of 1 hr/week. This hour will be utilized by holding discussions on various course topics.
- The modalities of mapping the MOOC courses with the curriculum will be done by Department Academic planning Committee for each department.
- The modalities of embedding the grades into our grading system may be looked into by Academic Section.
